

REGISTRATION OF TOWN OR VILLAGE GREENS - FROM APPLICATION TO DETERMINATION

Training webinar for County Council Officers delivered via MS Teams on the 20th January 2021

Introduction, Aims and Objectives

The aim of the seminar was to provide a general overview and legal update with regard to the process of applying for the registration of land as a Town or Village Green under the Commons Act 2006, (the 2006 Act), and the determination of such applications. The overview was intended for those new to the subject who may be less familiar with the issues and complexity of the legal principles in this area, although the legal update may also have been useful for more experienced professionals. With this in mind, particular emphasis was given to the impact of more recent case law concerning trigger events under section 15A of the 2006 Act and the issues surrounding the effect of statutory incompatibility.

The end of the session included a very brief look at some of the issues concerning section 38 of the 2006 Act with regard to works on registered common land and at deregistration of TVG's and exchange land.
